

HOW TO FOLD A PRINTER'S HAT:

1. Lay the 2 sheets, unfolded exactly on top of each other, and put them on table in front of you with the long side facing you and the Book Party logo right side up (not upside down). Fold in half to give you a center crease down the middle (which you will use as a guide later) and then unfold again to begin.

2. Grab the top right corner of both sheets and fold towards you until it reaches the center and fold. Do the same with the top left corner, so they come together evenly. The flaps will be two triangles.





3. Grabbing JUST the TOP sheet, fold the bottom edge up so it touches the bottom of the triangles. Press to fold.

4. Then fold it up again to overlap the bottom of the triangle, making a "cuff." The bottom sheet should stay put, and still be sticking out the bottom of the triangle.

5. Hold onto the cuff and flip the whole thing over. And fold the right edge into the center, and then do the same with the left edge so both edges come together at the center crease.

6. Then take the bottom right corner and fold it up to meet the bottom of the cuff and do the same on the left side. Press to crease.

7. Take the whole bottom and fold it over the cuff (fold A) and then tuck the extra into the cuff (fold B). Make sure the piece you folded into the cuff is completely tucked behind and crease it well.



8. Take the top point and fold it into the cuff.

9. Open the bottom of the hat with one hand on front and one hand on back and open it as far as it will go and press down to create a diamond shape (see illustration). The two edges that come together may overlap a bit and that is okay. Squish it to flatten into a diamond shape.

10. Fold the top of diamond (furthest away from you) into the top cuff and bottom of diamond (closest to you) into bottom cuff.

11. Take right corner and fold it into middle and do the same with left to make a square. Press folds very well.

12. Then open it back up again, creasing the corners to stay open, and place your printer's hat on your head!
